

The latest report from N3 shows that in the 12 months ended May, 114 members saved a total of \$254,095 (average \$2230) through the procurement programme. GST exemptions on B2B Training Contracts

As many will know, GST was lifted on B2B training contracts effective 1 April 2014. Reports from some of you suggest that the registration conditions for the overseas parties to secure the exemption can be onerous. We've been talking to MFAT and NZTE about this. Last week, in a meeting with the Whole of Government Aviation Committee in Queenstown, we agreed to try to do something. We'd like a better understanding of the issues you are facing.
