This document permits carriage of the above passenger's **spare batteries up to 60 (including two lithium ion batteries exceeding 100Wh but not exceeding 160Wh)**, on Air New Zealand, provided the following carriage requirements have been met:

Carriage Requirements

- all terminals must be protected e.g. retail packaging, taped, speciality container etc.
- not more than 60 (in total) are permitted
- carried in **carry-on baggage only**

Note: *Batteries in equipment are permitted in checked baggage, provided they do not exceed the above battery limits and the equipment is protected from damage and can't be accidentally turned on.*

Please extend every assistance to members of UAVNZ, with the carriage of these items.

Important

This Approval includes the carriage of a maximum of **two** lithium ion batteries exceeding 100Wh but not exceeding 160Wh.
